



An [Order Rescinding Statewide Court Administrative Orders and Memoranda](#) was issued by the Supreme Court on June 9, 2010. This order applies to all administrative orders entered statewide, not merely "statewide orders," as some members have questioned.

As an explanation of the Order, this definition was provided by court staff:

The line of demarcation between "administrative orders/memoranda" and "court rules" is that "administrative orders/memoranda" are regulations that govern *only* the courts' internal processing of the courts' work. Administrative orders/memoranda may regulate *only* how judges and judiciary employees process work. Regulations that govern attorneys' or litigants' work, including how, where, when and what they file, the form of documents, exhibits, declarations, or affidavits, or other matters that govern a non-Judiciary person's interactions with the courts in the processing of cases must be submitted as proposed amendments to the appropriate set of court rules.

Further information or explanation has not been issued by the Court.
