Hawaii State Bar Association Lawyer Referral & Information Service Rules for Attorney Membership

18. All Lawyer Referral & Information Service (hereinafter "LRIS") attorney members must be duly licensed to practice in the State of Hawaii and abide by the Code of Professional Responsibility promulgated by the Hawaii State Supreme Court.
2. All LRIS attorneys must maintain an active HSBA membership and full-time law office in Hawaii.
3. All LRIS members shall carry a minimum of \$100,000 in professional liability insurance coverage and will furnish their insurance carrier name, policy number and dates of effective coverage to the LRIS office annually.
4. All LRIS members must complete an application form designating only those areas in which they are qualified to practice.
5. A lawyer shall provide competent representation to a client. Competent representation requires the legal knowledge, skill, thoroughness, and preparation reasonably necessary for the representation. [Hawaii Rules of Professional Conduct Rule 1.1]
6. If an LRIS attorney or firm receiving a referral is not able to handle the matter, they should refer the case back to the LRIS.
7. Referrals are solely the responsibility of the member.
8. Because the LRIS is a public service, each member is expected to assist a referral to the fullest extent possible. If a referral does not need legal advice, each member agrees to forward the referral to an appropriate agency or suggest other means such as mediation or small claims court.
9. All LRIS members will notify the LRIS and the Hawaii State Bar Association of address and/or phone number changes in writing.
10. An LRIS member may withdraw their name from the program at any time by written notice to the LRIS at the Hawaii State Bar Association office.
11. Any determination by the appropriate body of the Supreme Court, State of Hawaii and/or the U.S. District Court, that an attorney has violated the Code of Professional Responsibility, resulting in suspension or disbarment, shall automatically cause removal of the attorney from the LRIS.
12. It will be the duty of each LRIS member to immediately notify the LRIS or the Bar Association office if a participating attorney becomes ineligible or disqualified, temporarily or permanently, to accept referrals from the Service.
13. Any disputes arising over fees as a result of employment gained through participation in LRIS shall be subject to binding arbitration by the Hawaii State Bar Association's Attorney/Client Relations Standing Committee.
14. Non-payment of dues after 30 days from the annual billing date (July 1) will result in termination of membership in the LRIS.
15. The number of panels established and the membership fees may be modified from time to time by the LRIS Committee.
16. Failure to comply with any of the duties set forth herein will result in removal from the LRIS.
17. Under no circumstances shall an LRIS member hold the Hawaii State Bar Association, staff, Board, or committee member liable for any acts or omissions in connection with the LRIS.
18. These rules are subject to change at any time without notice by the LRIS Committee as approved by the Hawaii State Bar Association Board.
