The practice of law is unique in Hawaii with its melting pot of cultures and rich state history. The HSBA Leadership Institute is designed to foster the professional growth and enhance the leadership of all ethnic and cultural groups that represent the HSBA membership.

WHY SHOULD I APPLY?

You will benefit personally and professionally and will be better prepared for leadership opportunities and challenges. You will have a chance to meet and interact with prominent legal and community leaders, gain insight on leadership skills and responsibilities, explore long-term opportunities, and form a lifelong network.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Any HSBA attorney in good standing who has 3 - 15 years of practice and who can make the commitment to attend all sessions for the entire time allotted. The selection process will be competitive, based on your resume and responses to the application. Class size is limited to 15 participants.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The HSBA Leadership Institute is an eight-month program with one class each month set with predesignated dates and times. Each program is facilitated by bar leaders and will feature prominent and authoritative speakers to cover the timely topics.

WHAT IS THE COST?

To create a meaningful and effective program that will become long-standing, a fee of \$200 payable to HSBA is due upon acceptance into the program to help defray expenses. The fee will also cover some lunch sessions throughout the program. Neighbor Island attorneys accepted into the program will be covered for air travel expenses on each program day.
