Investor-State Arbitration: Understanding the Structure of an Expanding Practice Area

With Professor David Caron, Law Professor at the University of California at Berkeley

Investor-State arbitration initiated primarily under a bilateral investment treaty is one of the main areas of growth in the legal profession. This arbitration between the claimant investor and the respondent government usually occurs before a panel of the International Center for Investment Disputes or a panel operating under the UNCITRAL Rules. The number of these arbitrations has exploded over the last 15 years. Professor Caron will speak to the origins and future trajectories of this dynamic area of arbitration.
